

Authorship Policy

For an individual to be credited as an author, they should have played a substantial role in the work detailed in the manuscript defined by meeting one or more of the following criteria:

1. Drafting or revising the manuscript.
2. Providing substantial intellectual contributions, such as:
 - Conceptualization of the idea.
 - Data collection and visualization.
 - Data analysis or interpretation.
3. Rigorously reading and reviewing the manuscript, thereby vouching for the integrity and accuracy of the content presented.

General Authorship Principles:

- All individuals who meet any of the above-mentioned criteria, irrespective of their position or institutional affiliation, will be listed as authors.
- The listed first author takes responsibility for the majority of the work presented including writing of the first draft and data integrity.
- Merely providing technical assistance or being involved in general supervision of a research group doesn't automatically qualify for authorship. However, if an individual believes their contribution is significant, this can be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.
